Community pharmacy instructions	 Student should commit to daily practical training except on Thursdays (in campus training) and the pharmacy day off. Training is preferred in community pharmacies in Jordan. Students are responsible for finding a community pharmacy for their training. The student must register for the course during the registration period (not during the withdrawal and addition period). No other courses should be registered with the training. The student should be available for training activities, only. The student must gather the pharmacy information as outlined in the training form and submit them online on pharmacy training link present in student services. This should be done after registering the course and within the 1st week after the beginning of training. During your practical training you MUST comply to the general safety instructions. In addition, you have to wear a clean white lab coat with a badge of your name. You have to behave responsibly and professionally in pharmacy. Course instructors/inspection team will conduct random field visits to trainees in pharmacies or make telephone calls to ensure that the students are being trained properly. Assignments/Mydispense reports should be finished on weekly basis.
