3 Credit Hours. This course offers a general introduction to morphology. It provides the students with knowledge of morphological terms and process that can be used to develop their skills in morphological analyses. It introduces students to how morphology interacts with other subfields of linguistics: phonology, syntax and semantics. The course trains students in these areas by examining morphological data from several languages which raises their awareness of the diversity of morphological systems found in languages of the world.
