CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

Throughout my career, I have gained skills in general anaesthesia and regional anaesthesia, particularly regional nerve blocks. I have also acquired substantial skills in difficult airway management and fibre-optic intubation and expertise in managing emergency and trauma cases. I have extensively managed anaesthesia in many different surgeries such as orthopedic, obstetric, ophthalmic, thoracic, major abdominal surgery and neurosurgery.

TEACHING AND EDUCATION:

As a teaching staff in faculty of medicine, I am responsible for providing regular teaching in the following:

Anaesthesia and Critical Care Residency Program

As head of the Anaesthesia and Critical Care Department, I supervise residents during their four years of residency training within our department. Over the last 15 years, I supervised the training of dozens of residents and many of the graduates from our residency training program are currently successful anaesthesiologists in various countries. Five of my current staff colleagues in our department are actually graduates from our residency training program. Our program focuses on teaching our residents anaesthetic skills in the operating theatre. Additionally, daily morning seminars are given in chosen anaesthetic topics.

Residents are encouraged to present cases with the purpose of sharing interesting medical cases and enhancing their confidence in their presentation skills. As head of department, I had a huge role in setting the curriculum. I strive to set an example in efficient team work, and always dedicate time to teaching the ethics of medicine.

Anaesthesia and Critical Care course for undergraduate medical students

As a faculty member of Jordan University of Science and Technology, I participate with my colleagues in teaching the Anaesthesia and Critical Care course (M553) to 4th year and 5th

year medical students. The two-week course includes daily seminars and clinical sessions, where I teach skills such as intravenous cannulation and intubation.

I give numerous lectures each year to dental and nursing students at Jordan University Hospital and nursing and physiotherapist staff at King Abdullah University Hospital.

As part of my responsibility to the community I live in, I have taken part in various activities that educate people on anaesthesia issues. For example, I did a TV interview on national television where I discussed anaesthesia and explained frequent queries people have.

We are a committee of anaesthesiologists who organise the qualifying exams (oral, written and clinical), which are the exit qualifying exams for anaesthesiologists in Jordan. As part of my role as head, I was responsible for gathering speakers and choosing arranging topics for the 5th International and 13th National Conference of Anaesthesia.
